6. Conclusions

The location of the WY under opposite the SREPs.

• Cellars underlying entrance.

• Stone wall = Western wall of entrance + a wall which once stood higher & therefore was an external wall: hence the ~~stone~~. No seen above ground as previous structure - as detailed in Basement Plan.

Walls 12 + 49 - it is possible that these walls are represented on the grand floor plan, rep as two semi-aligned walls located at the back of the entrance way bounded to the south from the entrance way from the south.

• The entrance Cellars as depicted on Photos would have been constructed upon the underground passageway walls.

• The decorative south face of (49) - Related to the threshold - Base of an elaborate door?
