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Date	Rationale of research activities and decisions undertaken
February-	First phase of Research – exploring wildness and ruin in urban spaces
July 2018	5-month sabbatical, with a focus on research exploring intermedial practices and
	city places in my home environment of Salford. Research methods employed
	throughout were regular and repeated walks into urban green spaces with a digital
	device, to record and experiment with the positioning of the device, body and
	space. A secondary set of methods centred on reformulating materials gathered in
	a mix with threads from critical reading and diaristic writing from the urban sites in
	question. Reading and engagement with theories around wildness, urban ruins and
	urban wildscapes continued throughout this period. Contexts, processes and
	findings of both phases of the research are outlined in Item 7
March 2018	Practice exhibit at Mask and Avatar Conference at University of Warwick
	Video and audio works that had developed through the first two months of the
	sabbatical were shared with delegates at this symposium. This video and audio later
	became incorporated into Item 2. Further information about these works and the
	event are available in the Appendix (Item 8)
May 2018	Presentation at ISTR Conference at University of Lincoln
	The first iterations of what will become Item 3 are presented and tested at this
	conference, which focused on 'Regions, Ruins and Regeneration'
June 2018	Presentation at User Not Found symposium, University of Reading
	At this event, I first tested some of the ideas I was developing about the wildness
	of digital processes. This then led into the second phase of the project from which
	Items 4, 5 and 6 emerged. A recording of the presentation is available in the
	Appendix in Item 8

July –	Forming of exposition on Research Catalogue platform
August	During this period I worked on forming the materials developed in the first phase
2018	of the research into an 'intermedial article'. This was developed further following
	review in the following year, leading to publication in early 2020 (see Item 3)
August	Second Phase of Research – wild walks and developing new processes for digital
2018 – June	devices in wild, green spaces
2019	In this phase, my attention focused on exploring different ways of being in urban
	green spaces with a digital device and disrupting relationships between the digital,
	the body and the urban wildscape. Again, this involved walking, playing and
	exploring in situ, in combination with reading, writing, reflecting, making and
	mixing in response to these encounters and to the ideas in play. I also concurrently
	started work on a 'wild' audio walk for two specific green spaces in East Salford –
	Peel Park and The Meadows (see Item 6).
September	Presentation at 'Situating the Groundwork' weekender, Milton Keynes
2018	The presentation I offered at the weekender in Milton Keynes, an event which
	offered a range of different approaches to creative practice in urban spaces,
	addressed the development of intermedial walking practices for urban wildscapes.
	Ideas presented here became the starting point for the digital postcard and audio
	walk I developed, represented in Items 4, 5 and 6.
November	Lecture for Society for Theatre Research: 'The Performer and the Digital:
2018	Networks of Feeling in Intermedial Practices'
	In this lecture, some of my developing ideas about intersections of digital and
	embodied practices were laid out. A recording of the event is available
	in the Appendix (Item 8)
January –	Work on digital postcard for Theatre, Performance and Dance Training journal
June 2019	and Peel Park and Meadows Wild Walk
	Throughout this period I worked on developing the audio, visual and critical
	resources I had gathered into the form of a mixed media digital postcard, as well
	as developing the route, form and text for the wild walk (Item 6), which reflected
	on specific instances of wildness in these spaces and the new developments that
	surround them.
July 2019	Publication of 'digital postcard' in Theatre, Performance and Dance Training
	Journal and Blog (Items 4 and 5)
July 2019	Peel Park and Meadows Wild Walk, presented as part of the Festival of Research
	at the University of Salford, in Peel Park, East Salford (Item 6)
2020	Publication of 'It's Cowboy Country Up there', as an exposition on the Research
	Catalogue platform
	The intermedial article was published on the Research Catalogue platform in early
	2020 (Item 3)
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
