Project | Raising Awareness / Calling for Action What It Entailed:

Within its relatively short time release, this message song got the attention of several news organizations, blogs, journals, and over 120 radio stations with more than 1,298,000,000 listeners. The song got downloaded / streamed for nearly 800,000 times across all digital platforms on its first month. It created a platform for discussions and dialogue across social media, streaming sites, and societies on the subject matter.

The project received two Gold and Platinum Awards for best Songwriter and best RnB Singer in the category of social impact songs.

A Contribution to Black History Month

The song also contributes to the annual observation of "Black History Month" – from February to March 1st.


